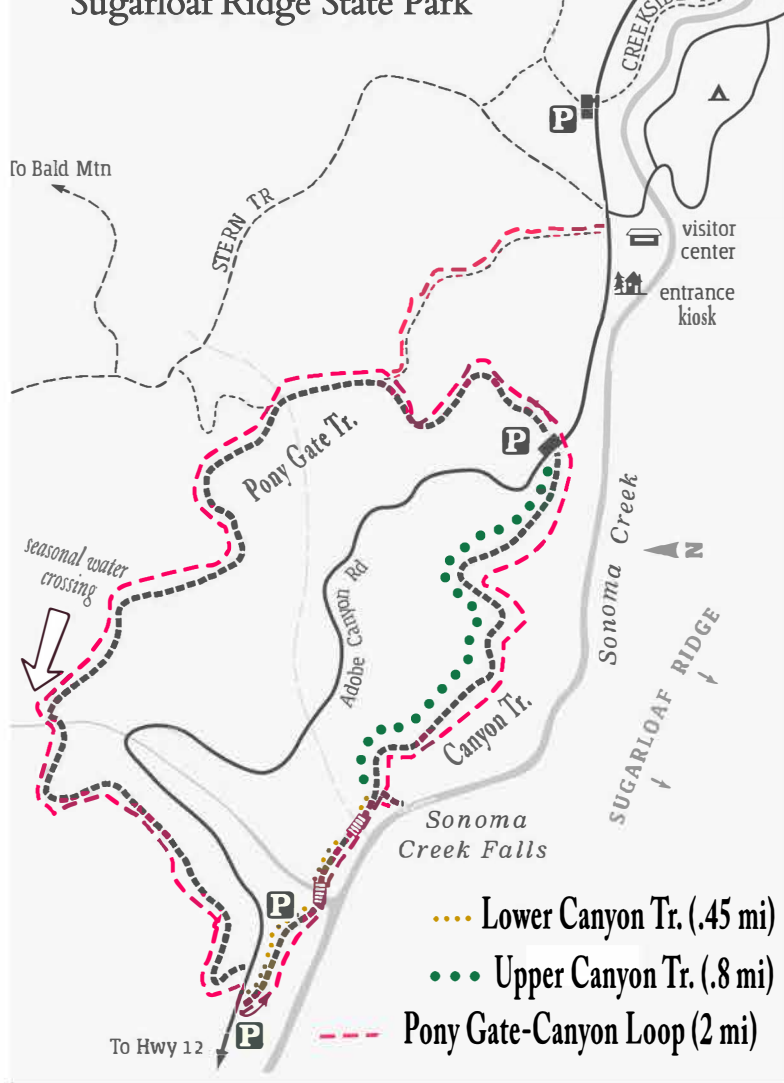


Waterfall Hike Options

Sugarloaf Ridge State Park



Shortest - Lower Canyon:

¼ mile past the green gate at the park entrance, look for 3 gravel pullouts. The pullouts are labeled as "Waterfall Parking" and "Fee Area"; if you do not have a Sugarloaf Annual Park Pass, come up to the main park area to purchase a day-use pass. There is no free parking along Adobe Canyon Rd.

The lower Canyon Trail is 0.45-mile round trip and includes some stairs and a 40-foot elevation change.

Middle - Upper Canyon:

1. Park at the upper Canyon lot, 300 yards before the entry kiosk, or park in the main parking lot and walk back past the kiosk.
2. Take the Canyon trail across from the Canyon lot and follow the steep trail with 100 stairs to the falls.
3. Take a left before the bridge. This small trail leads to Sonoma Creek Falls. Canyon Trail is 0.8 miles round trip with 400-foot elevation change and about 100 steps.

Longest - Pony Gate-Canyon Loop (recommended):

1. There are two ways to begin the Pony Gate / Canyon loop:
 - Option 1: Start at the Canyon parking lot, located 300 yards below the Entry kiosk. The Pony Gate trail starts at the upper corner of the Canyon parking lot.
 - Option 2: Start at the trailhead across from the kiosk to the left of the flagpole.
2. To access the second part of the loop, Canyon Trail, cross Adobe Canyon Road and look for Canyon trail about 30 yards downhill from Pony Gate.
3. The Pony Gate-Canyon Loop is 2 miles round trip, with a 450-foot elevation gain and over 100 stairs. We recommend starting on the Pony Gate Trail and returning via the Canyon Trail.
